



Release Notes (5/5/2015)

New Features

- Individual Fish List
 - First attempt to remove the 1000 record limit. You can now filter all the fish in the database. We may do more to improve performance, but this is a good start.
 - I also (temporarily) removed the “Search” box that searched within the filtered record set. I think I’ll probably restore that, but only for sets that are a manageable size.



- Encounter List
 - I also removed the 1000 record limit here, with the same caveats as above.



- Studies – Began revisions. Added a description field, and a place to indicate the river mile start and river mile end of the study.
